Sharing God's House

At the January 27, 2019 Annual Meeting a unanimous decision was made to share First Baptist Church building with New Heights Church. **We will begin sharing the worship space and education rooms on March 3, 2019.**

Implementation plan is in place and includes:

- Designated Space New Heights will use 5 classrooms on the lower level of the Annex for education purposes. The library, choir room and empty classroom by the sanctuary will be converted into office space for New Heights. Choir will rehearse in the sanctuary. First Baptist will use the upper level of the Annex for nursery, library and educational purposes.
- Shared Space The sanctuary, fellowship hall, kitchen, front office and large classroom behind the sanctuary will be shared and scheduled on a master calendar.
- Parking The east side of the church will be reserved for First Baptist Church. The handicapped parking on the south side of the church will be used by FBC with the exception of only the handicapped spaces that may be needed by New Heights.

A detailed Memorandum of Understanding between the 2 entities is available in the church office.

From the Pastor's Desk

Let me tell you about a commencement speech that was addressed to Harvard's Senior Class. On the morning of their graduation, seniors gather in Memorial Church to hear the minister offer words of solace and encouragement as they leave "the Yard" to take their places in the world.

The 1998 senior class heard the unvarnished truth from the Rev. Peter Gomes, minister at Harvard and the author of several books on the Bible. Doctor Gomes took no prisoners that day. He began: "You are going to be sent out of here for good, and most of you aren't ready to go. The president is about to bid you into the fellowship of educated men and women and, (and here he paused and spoke each word slowly for emphasis) you know just - how - dumb - you - really - are."

The senior class cheered in agreement.

"And worse than that," Doctor Gomes continued, "the world - and your parents in particular - are going to expect that you will be among the brightest and best. But you know that you can no longer fool all the people even some of the time. By noontime today, you will be out of here. By tomorrow you will be history. By Saturday, you will be toast. That's a fact - no exceptions, no extensions."

"Nevertheless, there is reason to hope," Doctor Gomes promised. "The future is God's gift to you. God will not let you stumble or fall. God has not brought you this far to this place to ABANDON you or leave you here alone and afraid. The God of Israel never stumbles, never sleeps, never goes on sabbatical. Thus, my beloved and bewildered young friends do not be afraid." (The Future is God's Gift by Peter Gomes)

This story is a good reminder for us as well. The future is a gift from God. We don't know what the future holds for us but we know **who** holds the future. We are in God's hands, we move forward with courage and faithfulness. Most importantly we move forward trusting God to lead us. Our job is to faithfully follow Him like we have for the last 153 years as a church and as faithful followers of Christ. May God continue to bless our church!



Jeni serves on the leadership team of the New Life Center Foundation in Chiang Mai, Thailand. She received one of our birthday cards and sent us this nice note:

"Thank you so much for the sweet birthday card and letter you sent! It is so kind of you to think of me here in Thailand. I had a wonderful birthday. A good friend made lots of plans to show me I am loved, and it sure worked. Your card added to my joy. Thank you!

Now we are less than two from Christmas, and I am reveling in the "cold" weather (70's all day today!). This is our winter, and the opportunity to wear a light-weight, long sleeved shirt is a treat. This is very rare in the tropics, where heat and humidity are the rule of thumb.

My work at New Life Center Foundation is always challenging. Every year I take on a little more. I truly enjoy living and working here. I'm actually finding the ideal of a "furlough" a bit stressful, because I have settled into life here. Can you imagine? I still pinch myself sometimes wondering if all this has really happened. I live in Thailand? I work at the New Life Center? Currently, we have around 50 young tribal women between ages of 13-20 living in our shelters. Most of them attend regular public schools in the area, but a few are home-schooled because they were not given the opportunity to go to school as young children, and are starting at the beginning of primary school, despite their age (14, 15, 16...). Please pray the love and care they receive at NLCF will point them to Jesus, always, and that they will choose Him.

I pray that this note finds you well in every way. Thank you again for remembering me. That alone is encouraging. May God give you a deeper wisdom and insight as you seek and serve him".
