From the Pastor's Desk

I recently read this great illustration about the Mary and Martha story and can't find the source. You remember the story of Mary and Martha in Luke 10:38-42. Martha, the mistress of the house, rushes around trying to make sure everything is perfect. Martha is like some first century Martha Stewart. She is focused on the food, the house, the drink. Martha seems to be doing for others. At first reading Martha is just being a conscientious hostess. But a deeper reading of the story reveals Martha is really only concerned with herself.

How does HER house look? How does HER food taste? How are HER wines being served?

Martha is so busy "serving" she completely forgets whom she truly serves...

In the classic Billy Crystal movie "City Slickers," three longtime friends face middle age. In their middle-age crisis they find themselves losing their focus and in danger of losing their families.

To reignite the fire in their lives the guys sign up as "cowboys," helping a dude ranch move its herd of cattle from high in the hills down to the lower valley. "Curly," the grizzled old cowboy, who leads them, seems to be the toughest, canniest, wisest person they have ever met. Billy Crystal asks the usually tight-lipped cowpoke what his secret is. What makes his life so strong and centered and sure? Curly smiles, raises his grubby, gloved index finger and proclaims, "It is just one thing," then he rides away.

Billy's character spends the rest of the movie frantically trying to figure out what Curly meant. What IS that "just one thing?"

Psychologists, marriage counselors, relationship gurus of all stripes, warn us not to expect one person to provide for all our emotional, intellectual, and relational needs. We need a variety of relationships, a network of spouses, friends, colleagues from work, basketball buddies, quilting club comrades, children, elders, and peers, to meet all our relational needs.

But what might be true for our human connections does not hold true for our spiritual needs. Our soul needs only "one thing." No matter what your denomination is. No matter if your spiritual temperament is exuberant, reserved, flamboyant, or meditative. Whether your soul craves cathedrals, or soars under the blue dome, it is all the same as long as we have that "one thing."

That "one thing" is Jesus.

International Global Servants – Haiti Health and Wellness STEVE AND NANCY JAMES

After Steve and Nancy provided 16 years of medical mission work at the Good Samaritan Hospital, Steve as a doctor and Nancy as a nurse, the Haitian Baptist Convention invited them to return to Haiti to help with medical assistance to Christian faith-based community health centers. Working as medical consultants, they both serve as members of local Christian health teams providing physical, mental and spiritual care in Jesus' name to those suffering in darkness. They feel blessed to be a part of God's healing work in the world. Steve and Nancy are supported as commissioned missionaries working jointly with the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and International Ministries. Following are excerpts from their journals:

July 5, 2018 began with patient consultations and treatments at the Norgesse and Mt. Tabor community Baptist churches mobile hypertension and diabetes clinics. When finished at the clinics we walked 30 minutes up the mountain to visit a 10-lb, 12-month-old, Rosenika, who is suffering from malnutrition and possibly Tuberculosis. Though breast-fed, her family is so poor that her mother lacks the daily calories to have adequate breast milk for her baby. We are networking with the community to have her brought to the Children's Hospital in Port-au-Prince for diagnosis and treatment. Her mother has already lost 3 children to poverty and infectious disease. As we prayed for little Rosenika and her mother, it felt as though we were standing on holy ground in the presence of Christ.

In Haiti, rarely a day goes by without a parent or child knocking on our door to ask if we can help with tuition fees. Often, students have to drop out of school because their families can't afford the tuition let alone the uniforms and books required for elementary and high school. Poor families often send their child to school only during months or years when they can afford it. Children can lose years of schooling and are often too old for their grade level if and when they do go back. Sadly some of the younger children end up carrying water for their families instead of learning to read, write, and calculate. There are no government loans or grants to help with education expenses.
