

Boaz serves in Kenya through the Kingdom of Peace and Development (KOPAD) organization promoting ministries of evangelism, discipleship and peace and conflict transformation. KOPAD's foundation for this ministry is based on Ephesians 2:14: "For Christ himself has brought peace to us. He united Jews and Gentiles into one people when, in his own body on the cross, he broke down the wall of hostility that separated us." (NLT) Boaz has been engaged in peacebuilding activities for over a decade. He provides conflict transformation training, mediation and reconciliation among the rural communities throughout east Kenya along the border of western Uganda. He also works in ministries of evangelism, church planting and discipleship with new believers. Boaz serves with IM as an International Associate Global Servant.

Rev. Boaz Keibarak was appointed in June 2019 to serve as an International Associate Global Servant in his home country of Kenya. He has been highly praised in peacemaking and conflict transformation by Karen Smith, IM area director in Africa and Rev.'s Dan and Sharon Buttry.

Boaz is married to Sophia Chepengat and the couple has two daughters, Hiemiah and Anastacia. Their home church is Rock Baptist Church, Kapenguria, Kenya. He will use English and Kiswahili languages in his ministry.
